- C. Vancouver PD had about 1000 stolen bikes they had recovered.
- D. 4% of stolen bicycles are returned to their owners

- F. Upload minimal info, serial number, and picture of bike.
- G. Coordination with bicycle shops in Vancouver to register new bikes, complete with 529 Shield Tag. Vancouver PD can see Tag and verify ownership.
- H. Had lots of volunteers to help with registration at neighborhood events.
- I. Next Steps to try and do something similar in the Bay Area:
 - a. Need major sponsor (BART, Bike Hub, MTC?)
 - b. SF – SF SAFE, SFPD, & SFBC
 - c. Start registering bikes of employees at places like REI, bike shops, etc.
 - d. Get momentum, other cities will follow.
 - e. Refine guidelines and finalize before the end of 2017.
